## In the Spotlight.....



Kudos to Town Meter Readers Tom Patterson and Jim Key. Since 2006, Public Works has been tracking town and county energy consumption in order to measure our progress. Tom and Jim started recording their mileage and took the time to examine how to run their routes more efficiently. In doing so they have shaved over 7,000 annual miles of travel off their route! It has saved time, money and fuel which is going a long way towards reaching the 10 x 10 goal. Jim and Tom were presented with certificates and highly efficient LED flashlights. Thank you for taking the time to figure out how to do your job with less energy!

**Did You Know...** Today's engines don't need a warm up. Start the car immediately and gently drive away. Prolonged idling increases emissions and wastes fuel. Turn the engine off in non-traffic situations, such as at bank and fast food drive-up windows, when idling more than 30 seconds.

## Department Update

**Town Hall** is a place where many different departments come together to make a difference in energy consumption. The building has recently received an energy efficiency face-lift. To start with **motion light sensors** were placed in the bathrooms. **Air handlers were replaced** in order to create a more comfortable indoor environment which will hopefully make those pesky space heaters disappear! **Programmable thermostats** were installed and some were reprogrammed which will save an estimated **15,000 kilowatt hours and about \$700 a year**. That much just from thermostats! Town Hall is estimated to gain another 2,000 annual kilowatt hours from a new photocell which will only illuminate the post lights and flag when it's actually
