



COURTHOUSE CORONAVIRUS NOTICE AND ORDER



THIS NOTICE AND COURT ORDER IS HEREBY given in the interest of public health to prevent the spread of COVID-19 (the Coronavirus), declared to be a worldwide pandemic and a National and State Emergency.

DO NOT ENTER if you have:

1. Been diagnosed with, or have had contact with, anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 virus;
2. Apparent symptoms of COVID-19 virus, such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath;
3. Been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital, or health agency;
4. Visited China, Iran, South Korea, any European countries, or any other high-risk countries identified by the CDC in the previous 14 days;
5. Traveled domestically within the United States where COVID-19 has sustained widespread community transmission;
6. Resided with or have been in close contact with any person in the above-mentioned categories.

Court security may question you about the above.

ENTRY INTO THIS PUBLIC BUILDING MAY NOT BE NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE. To minimize any spread of the Coronavirus, you must limit your use of the Courthouse:

- If you need to file something: The District Court and the Circuit Courts are allowing email and fax filings. Such filing is strongly encouraged. Please contact the appropriate Clerk's office for instructions on how to file.
- If you are here for a hearing: Many District Court and some Circuit Court hearings have been reset to occur by video or telephone. If you are represented by an attorney, please contact your attorney to confirm how you are to appear. If you are an attorney here for a hearing, contact the appropriate court to confirm this is an in-person hearing.
- If you have business at the Circuit Court Clerk's Office or are here to pay a fine: Please contact that office by telephone first, to determine whether the business can be done electronically.
- If you have business at the District Court Clerk's Office: Please contact that office by telephone first, to determine whether the business can be done electronically.
- If you are scheduled to meet with the Teton County Attorney's Office: Please contact that office by telephone.
- If you have no attorney and are seeking emergency relief: Please call the Clerk's Office for the court where you would seek relief.
- If in doubt as to whom you should contact, please call the Clerk's Office for the particular court in which your matter would be addressed.

Individuals attempting to enter restricted areas will be denied access by courthouse security or authorized individuals.

These precautions are temporary but will remain in place and may be updated until it is determined safe to remove them. People who think they may have been exposed to coronavirus are urged to contact St. John's Health at (307)739-4894 option 3 for a phone evaluation.
