	<p>Message from Unified Command 03/31/20:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • With yesterday's State Executive Order allowing restaurants and bar & grill liquor license holders to sell limited beer and wine for off-premise consumption, Unified Command reminds everyone that age restrictions and all other requirements for liquor sales still apply.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • JHCOVID.COM has been launched as a one stop shop for all information regarding the pandemic locally, jhcovidespanol.com a Spanish version of this site has now also been launched. • Community Foundation of JH has activated their Community Emergency Response Fund to support local nonprofits directly impacted by COVID-19. • St. John's Health Foundation launches COVID-19 Response Fund for SJH employees. • One22 has activated their COVID-19 Financial Relief Grants for individuals affected by COVID-19. • JH Food Help webpage has been set up to include all resources for food assistance. • DishingJH has created an alternate dining options list. • Teton County School District: During Spring Break, Hole Food Rescue will provide meals at JH High School from 11am-1pm, Monday through Friday. On 3/30/20 they distributed 92 meals. • Teton County School District buildings and grounds are presently closed - except for the West parking lot at the High School for public access to the meals program. This closure includes fields, playgrounds, skate park and other assets located on District property. While TCSD understands the desire of families to access recreational spaces, TCSD does not have the staff resources available at present to support the opening, cleaning or maintenance of any District Facilities. • JH Chamber of Commerce is maintaining a Status of Lodging in Jackson Hole spreadsheet available to the public.

State map of cases by county available here. • Total tests completed 2,108 in Wyoming (+174): Public Health Lab: 1,563, Com. Labs: 544, CDC: 1. • WY State Lab on 3/31/20 has completed 71 tests for Teton County WY, with 10 tests pending. • St. John's Health daily COVID-19 statistics for 03/31/20 at 10:15 am: 5 tests submitted (-1), 140 tests submitted to date (+5), 89 Telehealth visits (+73), 69 COVID hotline calls (+18), 4,245 Visits to COVID webpage (+621). • Teton County WY COVID-19: 20 (+4) cases & 0 deaths. Community spread confirmed. • Teton County, Idaho number of confirmed cases 3. State of Idaho issues Stay-at-Home Order. • Several Public Health Orders are in effect at the County and State levels. Teton County Health Department is keeping a running list of these on their website. State extends three state public health orders to April 17. County Public Health Order #20-3 issued requiring stay at home order of older adults, including an easy-to-read explanation of the order. • County Health Officer issues Public Health Recommendations #5 and #6 for all residents of Teton County, recommending all residents, regardless of age, stay home except for essential purposes and for those that leave the geographic area to quarantine for 14 days. • Countywide Public Health Order #20-4 and related press release were issued requiring all people within Teton County, Wyoming, including the City of Jackson, Wyoming to limit gatherings to only individuals within the same household. • Town repeals Emergency Ordinance 1249 requiring town residents to stay at home within the Town of Jackson only, upon issuance of Countywide Public Health Order #20-4 limiting gatherings to only individuals within the same household.
