Testing capacity is increasing every day, and restrictions on who can be tested have been reduced. • Town of Jackson <u>continues to discourage</u> antler shed hunters from coming to Jackson for opening day due to COVID-19 concerns. • Governor Mark Gordon will be holding a COVID press conference <u>live online</u> on April 28 at 4:00pm. • Teton County voted to <u>extend public access restrictions</u> at all County buildings through May 4, 2020. • Teton County <u>COVID Dashboards</u> have been updated with new graphs, indicators, and statistics to include probable cases in total case counts.
