The Teton County Board of County Commissioners requests proposals for Professional Services for the purpose of Developing a Geographic Information System (GIS) digital layer of designated vegetation and non-vegetation cover types for land use planning purposes on all lands in Teton County, Wyoming, excluding land within federal ownership. Proposals will be received at the Teton County Planning Department, 200 S. Willow St., P.O. Box 1727, Jackson, Wyoming 83001, on or before 4:00 p.m., March 1, 2012 at which time said proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud in the County Commissioner's Chambers. Proposals shall be sealed and shall state on the outside of the envelope or packaging: Veg Mapping RFP. Cost Proposals shall be sealed separately within the envelope or packaging containing the proposal.

The Teton County Board of County Commissioners will open proposals for professional services and select the proposer most suited for the work. The Teton County Board of County Commissioners will negotiate a professional services contract with the selected proposer as deemed in the best interest of the Teton County.
